



ELECTIONS

HUB ELECTIONS (FEBRUARY 2022)

Hub Elections are an important part of the Abuja Hub's Charter.

Each year the Hub holds a democratic election in February to vote in a Curator and a Deputy Curator for the upcoming hub year.

This year the Hub saw the likes of 2 candidates; Princess Ike and Elmer Aluge (who later stepped down due to personal reasons) for the position of Curator and 1 candidate; Jesse Dan-Yusuf for the position of Deputy Curator. Princess Ike was voted in as Curator elect, while Jesse Dan Yusuf was voted in as Deputy Curator elect for the 2022/2023 hub year.





CURATORSHIP HANDOVER CEREMONY

On the 25th of June 2022, the 2021/2022 Curatorship (Umar Abdulmalik and Akumishi Ayenajeh) handed over the mantle of the hub's leadership to the 2022/2023 Curatorship (Princess Ike and Jesse Dan Yusuf).





ENGAGEMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY

INTRODUCTION

Shaper engagement represents the degree to which a shaper is personally aligned with the aims, objectives and values of the hub as it directly impacts on the hub's ability to survive and flourish. It is therefore important for the hub to take a more informed, robust and structured approach to ensure that shaper engagement activity is truly optimised.

OBJECTIVES

- To increase the vitality of the hub.
- To improve overall engagement of all active shapers.
- To give objective reviews of shapers based on standard metrics which will be useful for fairly evaluating for rewards.
- To provide information and justification for termination of membership

ENGAGEMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY INDICATORS

- Attendance to hub meetings: 30% will be allocated for this and will only be gotten from the minutes of meetings or the secretariat.
- Hub dues: 40% will be allocated for this and will be gotten from the finance team of the hub quarterly or as convenient.
- Attendance to projects and events: 30% will be allocated for this. (Shapers must attend at least one of the two a month to claim points) and for this, attendance shall be collected and documented.

SHAPER OF THE QUARTER

Shaper of the Quarter and year was introduced to the Hub in the year 2021/2022 to appreciate the hard-work, dedication and commitment of a well-performing and deserving Shaper for the period of 3 months.

The Shaper of the Quarter is selected on the basis of an engagement and accountability tracker which includes three main parameters for assessment; payment of hub dues, attendance to hub meetings and attendance to projects and events with points allocated for each parameter.

Only shapers who scored an average of 70% within a quarter were eligible for this award and were awarded an e-certificate and a token of appreciation.
